**SAMPLE SIZES:**

**ALL / LIKELY VOTERS = 2708**

**AZ = 600, CO = 600, MT = 408, NM = 500, NV = 600**

*This survey was conducted using an online methodology among likely voters and was in the field from June 2-17, 2020. The margin of error (MOR) for the full sample of 2708 completed interviews is +/- 2%. The MOR for states with 600 interviews is +/- 4%. The MOR for states with 500 interviews is +/- 4%. The MOR for MT is +/- 5%. These calculations are based on the 95% confidence interval. Some results may not add up to 100 due to rounding.*
