
### A few facts about Western wildlife

### THREATS TO WILDLIFE HABITAT

Sage grouse populations have decreased by 80% since 1965 and nearly 40% since 2002.<sup>1</sup>

At least 350 species rely on the same habitat as sage grouse.<sup>2</sup>





Big game species like elk, pronghorn, and mule deer rely on migration corridors that traverse private, state, and federal land.

There has been a 38.65% decrease in mule deer migration due to energy development over a 14-year period.<sup>3</sup>


### **PUBLIC SUPPORT**

9 in 10 Western voters say public lands, parks, and wildlife issues are important to them.<sup>4</sup>




Support public lands
